



## PROGRAMA DE DOCTORADO EN CREATIVIDAD APLICADA

### ADDITIONAL TRAINING

In general terms, all students admitted into the program shall need to complete a training complement: Course on Anthropological and Ethical Bases of University Research or any course that may substitute this course in the future.

The diversity of applicant profiles for the Doctoral Degree in Applied Creativity demands for all successful applicants to take part in other training complements, other than the complement mentioned above, suitable for research doctoral programs. Subject to the applicant profiles envisaged, it is established:

1. Recommended student profile: Up to 9 ECTS credits of courses out of the Graduate offer of Universidad de Navarra on subjects directly related to the topic of research. These students may be exempt from training complements when they credit sufficient graduate training or sufficient professional experience in line with the topic of research selected.
2. Students with a prior training in the Undergraduate Degree in Arts and Humanities, Social and Legal Sciences, Architecture and Engineering, or any field regarding design, as well as students with a graduate training in such areas holding a Master's Degree not oriented to research: up to 12 ECTS of courses out of the Graduate offer of Universidad de Navarra in subjects directly related to the topic of research and/or of a methodological nature.
3. Students with a prior training in Science or Health science and with Graduate training in those fields or other fields as part of masters specially oriented, or not specially oriented towards research: up to 20 ECTS out of the graduate offer of Universidad de Navarra in subjects directly related to the topic of research and/or of a methodological nature.

Specific training complements for doctorate applicants shall be assigned by the Academic Committee out of the Graduate offer of Universidad de Navarra.

Administered by the Institute Core Curriculum

**Content:** The course includes several sessions, administered by the University's faculty. It has a cross-disciplinary approach and includes different topics that reflect the educational project of Universidad de Navarra together with the anthropological and ethical bases for research and teaching. As a general basis, every class has a duration of one hour and a quarter, which includes the speaker's exhibition (some 40minutes) and the subsequent dialogue (some 30 minutes). Some sessions are under the shape of a round table with two speakers, others are classes where texts are analysed and subjects are discussed in groups.

**Methodology:** On-campus methodology: Attendance to sessions is compulsory together with the completion of a final project.

**Course date and Course place:** (the student must complete this course in December or May, in the morning or in the afternoon respectively).
