INTRODUCTION

Qualitative research provides a way to approach reality from the individual perspective and provides a closer view of human beings, taking into account the contexts in which people live and how their personal experiences influence in their life and behaviour. Understanding a person's motivations, goals in life, values, feelings, beliefs, and preferences is essential to health care professionals caring for people with advanced illness and in the terminal phase, if their work is to be effective. It is important to know the experiences being lived by the different people involved in this end-of-life phase (patients, relatives, and health care professionals) in order to improve the care and the accompaniment for a patient in this situation.

This course on qualitative research has been organized for healthcare professionals and focuses on qualitative data analysis. Qualitative studies generate awareness and knowledge, which when put into practice, improves the attention and care given to patients.

The course is organized by the ATLANTES Research Program of the Institute for Culture and Society (ICS).
