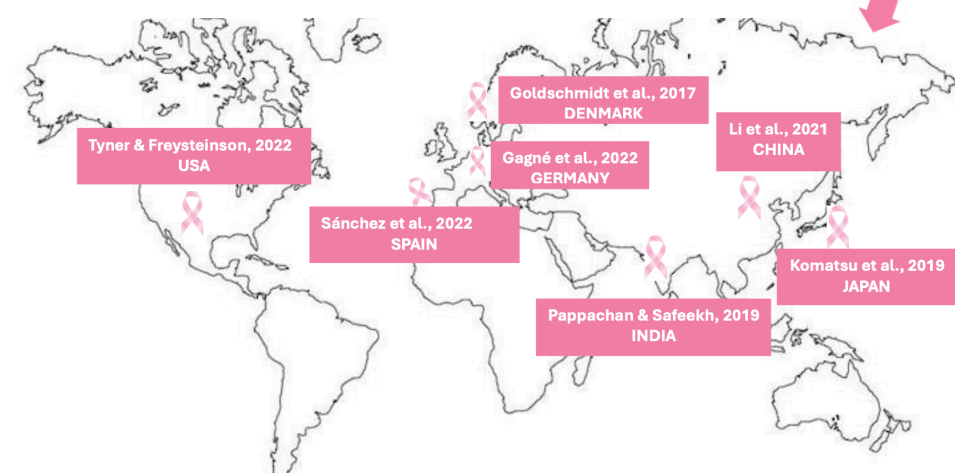
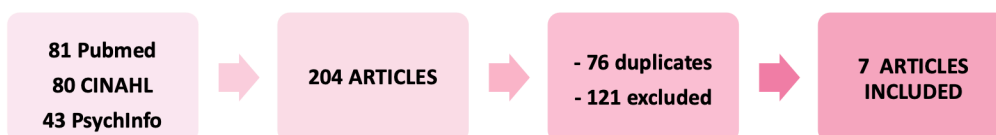

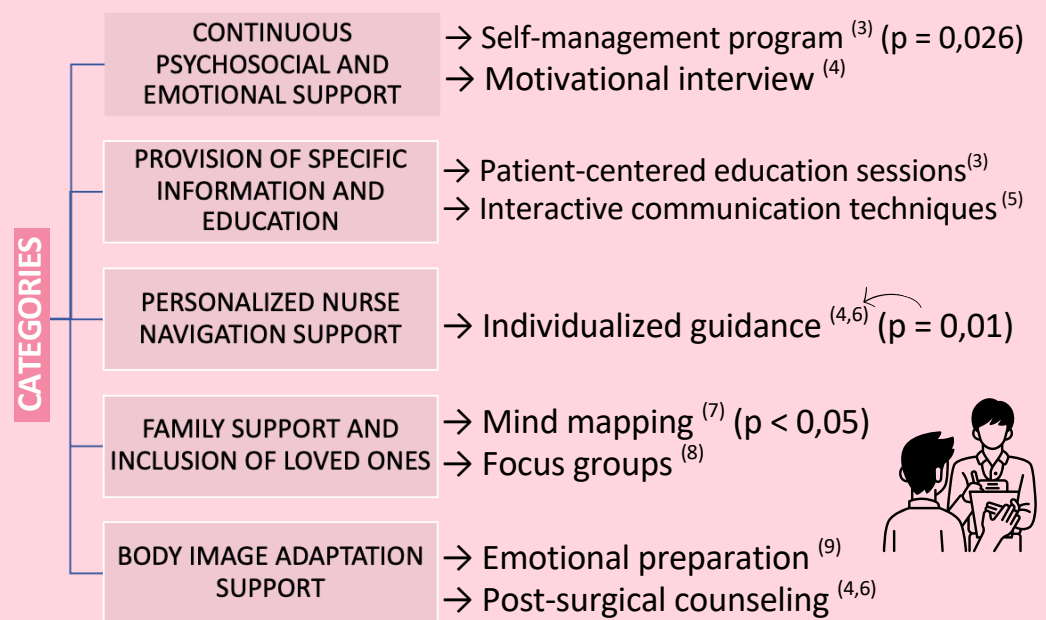

### PATIENT EDUCATION FAMILY INVOLVEMENT PERSONALIZED NURSE NAVIGATION

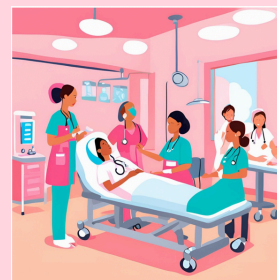
- Empowers patients

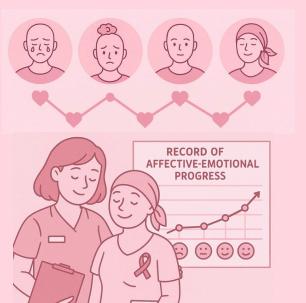
