RULES FOR THE HISTORY OLYMPICS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NAVARRA

1. PARTICIPANTS

- Open to all students in their 4th year of ESO, 1st and 2nd of bachillerato from any High School of Navarra.
- Participation is individual.
- Each school may submit to the Olympics a maximum of approximately 10 students. The teacher will decide the selection process of these students for the Olympics.

2. ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

It consists of history teachers from the following institutions:

Same as in previous editions, after students have completed the registration procedure, the organization will ensure that members of the committee are not associated with any of the schools the students are coming from. If so, those members will not participate in the preparation and evaluation of the test, although they will continue to be part of the committee on the following year. Even though tests are anonymous, the desire of the organization has always been to follow this procedure.

3. REGISTRATION

- The registration of students to the Olympics will be made by a teacher from their own school.
- Registration will be made by completing the form available on the Olympics website.
- The deadline for registration is January 31 of the corresponding year.
- Registration is free and implies acceptance of these rules.

4. DEVELOPMENT

- The Olympics will consist of a single written test.
- The test consists of a topic for development and a text or image (related to the general theme specified for the First Olympics) for analysis. Both parts are related.
- The available time is two hours.
- The text may be written in Castilian, Basque or English.
- In order to ensure anonymity, the pages of scripts by the candidates will be identified by DNI number only.

5. TOPIC

• Each year the committee will chose the topic for the Olympic from the contents of the 1st Bachillerato's World History course.

6. SCORE

- The test will be given a mark of up to 10 by the organizing committee, using the following criteria:
 - Historical knowledge, insight and ability to relate the question to develop with the text or image to comment: 8 points
 - Vocabulary, language and writing skills: 1 point
 - Presentation, thematic organization, clarity of expression: 1 point

7. PRIZES

- There will be six winners, divided into first prize, second prize, third prize and three consolation prizes. There will be no distinction of categories by language.
- The first three prize-winners will receive:
 - A gift certificate from the Tienda Universitaria (Troa group) for books and school supplies to the value of 125 € for first, 100 € for the second and 75 € for the third.
 - A set of History books donated by Alianza Editorial for the first three prize-winners
 - A tuition discount in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Navarra if they register. This discount will be 1200 € for the first prize, 900 € for the second and 600 € for the third.
- The consolation prizes will receive a history book donated by Alianza Editorial.
- All winners will receive a certificate.
- All participants will also receive a certificate.
- The committee may decide not to award any prize.
- The tribunal will be composed of the organizing committee and its decision is final.
- The list of winners will be kept secret until the awards ceremony to be held at the University of Navarra.
- Teachers who participate will also receive a certificate.
