ADVANCED PLACEMENT POLICY (AP EXAMS)

What is the AP Score? The AP score shows how well a student did on the AP Exam administered by the College Board. It is a measure of a student’s achievement in their college-level AP course.

How is it used? For Advanced Placement. This score is used by ILCE Universidad de Navarra to allow students to skip the equivalent Spanish university course once they get to **Universidad de Navarra**. This is known as advanced placement. ILCE Universidad de Navarra does not grant students credit for what they already learned.

What is the meaning of my AP score? The student’s score is a weighted combination of scores on the multiple-choice section and on the free-response section. The final score is reported on a 5-point scale as follows:

- 5 = extremely well qualified
- 4 = well qualified
- 3 = qualified
- 2 = possibly qualified
- 1 = no recommendation
