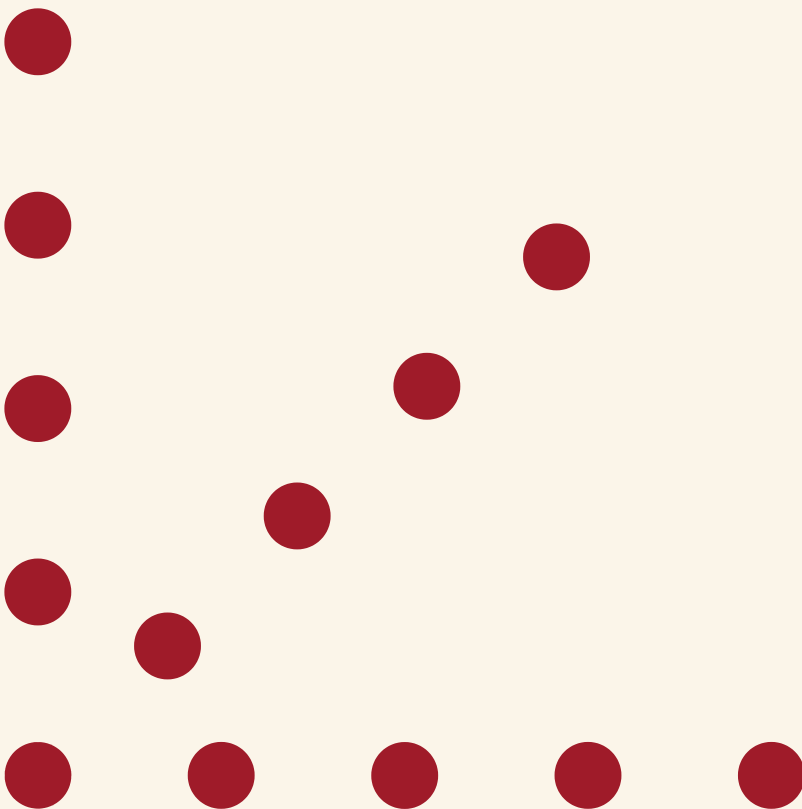

Meet up, level up, and be a risk-taker towards meeting new people from around the world.

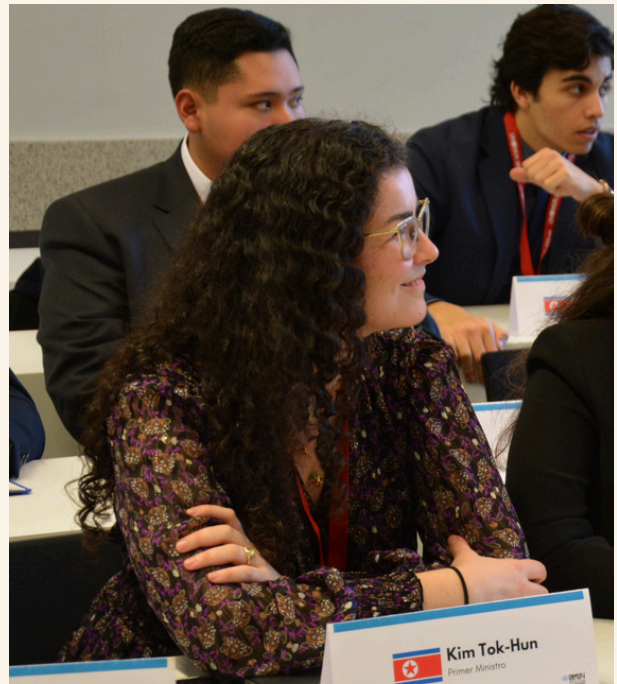


